Most people are familiar with the strengths (1) $\qquad$ weaknesses of popular Internet search engines like Google or Yahoo. Sometimes you can find what you're looking for instantly whereas at other times, searching for something which may or may not exist can be a frustrating and time-consuming experience.

One place you can go to, to get the information you want is Wikipedia. As it's name suggests it's a form of encyclopedia. It's already the largest information source in history (2)
$\qquad$ it contains a massive amount of information. What makes Wikipedia unique, though, is that it's a democratic project. (3) $\qquad$ , the content is completely free to access, (4) $\qquad$ it's written entirely by unpaid volunteers. Changes and additions are being made all the time to articles which exist already. (5) $\qquad$ , it's also possible to contribute whole new articles. Basically, anyone can contribute, once they've understood the basics of editing the pages.

A question that many people ask is, 'How can I tell if the information is accurate?' Some people, (6) $\qquad$ example, professionals and academics, have criticised Wikipedia for this very reason. The short answer is you can't tell, (7) $\qquad$ then how can anybody be sure that the information in a conventional encyclopedia is accurate? (8) $\qquad$ , how can you be sure the information in a newspaper is accurate?
(9) $\qquad$ , it's unlikely that the more conventional information sources will ever be completely replaced by Wikipedia, (10) $\qquad$ this ambitious project has helped make information available to everyone who has the Internet. Anyone can contribute and anyone can read it, and, most importantly, it's free. (11) $\qquad$ , it is completely democratic (12) $\qquad$ it isn't only available to people with the ability to pay.
